

**IN MEMORY OF SOME COLEORTON MEN
WHO WERE KILLED OR DIED AS THE
RESULT OF INJURIES SUFFERED IN WWI**

ARCHIBALD HOLT

Private, Coldstream Guards, died of wounds, September 22nd, 1918.
Private Archibald Holt, fourth son of Mr and Mrs W. Holt, Coleorton, died of wounds in the Base, Leicester, on September 22nd 1918. He enlisted in the Coldstream Guards on August 5th, 1914, being transferred to the London Regiment in 1917. He had seen a lot of active service in France, being wounded four times. The internment took place with military honours at Coleorton Cemetery on September 26th. The 'Base' was in New Walk, Leicester and was a base for district nurses and health visitors

CECIL CUTHBERT

Private, Northumberland Fusiliers, killed in action, August 25th, 1918.

F. HUBBARD

Private, Leicestershire Regiment, killed in action, March 1918.

GEORGE ARTHUR WALKER

Sergeant of the Leicestershire Regiment, killed in action, July 14th, 1916. Aged 21.

PERCY WALSTER

Private in the Leicestershire Regiment, killed in action at the Persian Gulf, April 6th, 1916, aged 26 years.

JOSEPH MARTIN

Lance-Corporal of the Royal Sussex Regiment, single, aged 31, a gardener, killed in action in France, March 3rd, 1916.
